Dear Friends:

When you receive this issue of the Spire we will be entering into the season of Advent. The word "advent" comes to us from the Latin advenio which literally means "to come." Advent is a season of preparation - preparing not only for the coming of Jesus as a baby born in Bethlehem, but at the same time looking forward to the Second Coming of Jesus Christ! Often we get so busy preparing to celebrate the birth of the baby lesus

that we forget he will be coming again.

As we move week-by-week through the season of Advent we will be taking time to consider who lesus was and is, in our sermon series entitled, "Name Calling." We will specifically focus on the names of Jesus from Isaiah 9:6, "... Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace."

In order to help you engage in this series we invite you to read the book on which this series is based, Names for the Messiah: An Advent Study by Walter Brueggemann. (Copies available through the church office.) In addition, we will send via email (also available in hard copy at NPC) a guide for lighting an Advent wreath with your family, questions to consider, as well as activities to engage you and your children as you prepare for the celebration of Christmas.

In the midst of this season of Advent, the interim work continues to move forward. We have now entered into Stage 3, a time of self-study in which we think through our history, reflecting on who we have been as a congregation, and seek God to dream about who God desires us to be and what God desires us to do in ministry and mission. This process will continue into the winter and early spring. Watch for information about how you can be a part of this process.

It is my sincere desire and prayer this Advent season that each of you set aside some time to reflect on God's indescribable gift - a child who would come to show us grace and forgiveness, die for us, and come back to life to reign in our hearts and rule the world as King of Kings and Lord of Lords.



y cousins and I have an 'insider' phrase that we are using as our extended family wrestles through some difficult issues: **Goat Rodeo**.

I looked it up on Urban Dictionary: Goat Rodeo: A chaotic situation, often one that involves several people, each with a different agendalvision/perception of what's going on; a situation that is very difficult, despite energy and efforts, to instill any sense or order into.

Yup. Goat Rodeo is exactly what my people are wrestling with this season in California.

It got me to thinking: Christmas has some *goat rodeo* elements to it. How many different visions/perceptions/agendas are there at your home as you prepare for the holiday? Who's in charge? Do others know that they're not in charge?

My house feels like a goat rodeo more often than not, with a dog, a cat, two teen-aged boys and parents constantly moving in all kinds of directions. Add Christmas into the mix, and we have a potential for a very entertaining rodeo. And these are good years. This is joyful chaos!

I believe that the Christmas story in scripture also has some 'goat rodeo' elements: Mary and Joseph were eventually at peace: But what about their parents? The shepherds running around Bethlehem in the middle of the night with wacky news? No pun intended, but sounds like goats to me. Three Magi setting off to follow a star? A star? And what about Herod?

Who's in charge? What's the agenda?

Well- God is in charge, of course. And Redemption is the agenda.

I wonder how much the individual players in Scripture knew about the big picture of God's redemption plan? I love the way that God brings order out of chaos. The way that we are so often brought to the edge and limit of our own abilities. The way that we are forced to see that we, in and of ourselves, are deeply flawed. It's the *grace* of God that reaches down into our goat-rodeos and rescues us. And when we are lifted out by grace, we often can see the bigger picture: how we fit into the beautiful big picture of the *grace* of God.

My prayer for us this Christmas is that we will be able to look outside of our own chaotic circumstances- our own *goat rodeos* and see the way that God's grace is reaching in to pull us out! Using a vulnerable infant, some wacky shepherds and a jealous king.

Minute with Mickie – What do you Wonder about?

ou know me, I LOVE to wonder about stuff. It's one of the reasons why I got my Masters in Philosophy from Aberdeen

University in Scotland. I'm just a curious sort of person. I think I got that from my mother. As I was growing up, whenever I would ask a question her response was most likely "Hmmm, good question, I wonder about that too. What do you think?" And off we would go, thinking critically and discussing. Rarely do I remember pat answers or the proverbial dismissal, "Go look it up." No, in my family, we wondered about stuff and talked and debated and researched and laughed!

This is the approach that our Children's Ministry's Sunday School teaching takes as well. We wonder about God's Word and God's Stories. We wonder about the projects that we do as we re-tell those stories. We wonder about the historical context, about what the story is telling us about God, and why God wanted us to know this particular story. I also encourage your children to wonder about with whom they might need to share the story since we know that God's Word is

meant to be shared and re-told. I encourage them to tell YOU the story. Every week. We wonder.

Every few months, your children are given the story booklets that contain the Bible stories as well as various Wonder Questions that YOU can wonder about with them. These booklets also contain hands-on activities to do together at home. It is our theological belief that God is personally revealed to us through the Bible and so, we encourage you to wonder about what God is telling you through God's Word. Aren't you the least bit curious? I would hope so.

Wondering is the seedbed of critical thinking. Critical thinking is a must for the people of God who live in a world where rash judgment, ignorance, lying, deceit, politicking, greed, self-aggrandizement, unkindness emotional chaos and conclusion jumping are the rule of the day. In the same way that you, as a parent, are intimately involved with your children's secular education, sports, extra-curricular activities, choice of friends, and their technology input, please be involved with their spiritual education. Join them in the journey

As educarers, we support their beginning steps toward self-directed, life-long learning, providing the social, emotional, cognitive, physical and moral foundation needed to navigate our diverse and complex world.

Refugee Resettlement Co-Sponsorship

"Defend the weak and the fatherless; uphold the cause of the poor and the oppressed. Rescue the weak and the needy; deliver them from the hand of the wicked." Psalm 82:3-4

ne year ago here at NPC, I attended a talk by Chris George, Executive Director of New Haven based IRIS- Integrated Refugee & Immigrant Services. I wanted to hear his talk because I knew what God commanded us to do to help the poor and oppressed, but to be honest, I was afraid. I had visions of giving aid to someone who would want to do harm to our community.

During the talk, I learned the vetting process is thorough and extensive, and no one is actually resettled unless their identity, background, motives, and affiliations have been investigated beyond doubt. The initial vetting is conducted by the U.N.'s refugee agency, which usually refers the most vulnerable applicants to the U.S. At the top of the list are survivors of torture, victims of sexual violence, targets of political persecution, the medically needy, and single mothers with children.

I learned there are nine U.S. government agencies, including the State Department, the Department of Defense and the FBI's Terrorist Screening Center who conduct background checks of their own. Officials with the Department of Homeland Security travel abroad to conduct in-person interviews with every applicant. Fingerprints and iris scans are matched against criminal

databases. Biographical information such as past visa applications are scrutinized to ensure the applicant's story coheres. The process takes 18 to 24 months, and some 50% are rejected.

After learning about the process, I began to understand how safe it was and felt that if God wanted me to be a part of this ministry, he would go before me if I would fully trust him. So, I became part of the NPC Refugee Co-Sponsorship Team. We are deep into our preparations and I can tell you, the joy is unmeasureable. Knowing our obedience will provide a new life to a family who has no hope, is such a blessing. I believe love will conquer hate and those who are given hope and love will choose it over hate. "For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in" Matthew 25:35.

Our part in the process is to act as Friend, Advocate and Helper, especially in the early days when there is a huge cultural adjustment and many demands on the family to register for social services/schools/look for employment/ attend health assessments/learn English/ navigate the

transport system and more! IRIS is experienced in managing this process and guiding us as we partner with them.

We already have a core team who are preparing in advance for

the family, researching resources that will be needed and gathering household supplies/furniture for their home. (You may have already helped with this!) 
