Reconnecting and **Staying Connected**

recently learned that a church member, who had become

isolated over the past few years, was in the hospital for two weeks. No one had called the church to let us know. (It used to be that ministers could drop by the hospital, look over the admission list and see if we knew anyone. HIPAA privacy laws have changed all of that.) I felt horrible when I learned this. All it would have taken was a phone call and we could have been there.

People withdraw from church for a variety of reasons. For some, declining health or mobility issues or even being widowed makes it harder to come to church alone. For others, the graduation of the youngest from high school permits greater travel and thus, less regular weekend attendance. Sometimes a sermon topic offends a person. There might be the difficulty of the competing weekend sports schedules or recreational hobbies. I understand these ebbs and flows of life, but being a member of church is like being a member of a family - whatever is happening - we miss those who aren't with us and we still care about

them in all of life's ups and downs.

How do we as pastors and we as a church family get the word out that we care about our members who have drifted away? In a large church like ours with multiple services, it is admittedly difficult to do. We don't know if someone is traveling, sick, visiting a relative or are they now drifting away? Studies show that a "re-invite" after two months of absence may be all it takes to reengage a member. We all need to be on the look out for those we haven't seen in a while and let them know that we noticed their absence and that we care - encourage them to come back in a friendly and gracious way. Our upcoming beach services offer a great opportunity to do this. We will start worshipping at Weed Beach on June 15. (We will continue our tradition of a 10 a.m. service in the air-conditioned chapel – with no childcare available in July when we remodel the CE wing.) The service begins at 8 a.m. and a beach sticker isn't required to attend. On June 22nd we will host a brunch at the beach. This would be a wonderful setting for reconnections or even for inviting new friends.

Our church should always be a

- Jimmy Carter A Call to Action: Women, Religion, Violence and Power. A very informative book about global issues, written through the lens of a devout Christian brother.





• Timothy Keller - Walking with God through Pain and Suffering. A more academic approach to the question of suffering. A rich read—but not for the beach!



Minute with Mickie Wondering about Transitions

"Sometimes life takes us places we never expected to go. And in those places God writes a story we never thought would be ours." ~ Renee Swope

So how many transitions have you been through in your life? Or, perhaps you feel like I do, "When ISN'T there a transition?" Transitions are those moments in life when whatever you thought was the "status quo" is no longer. We transition from childhood to teenagers to adults. We transition from being kids at home, to kids at school, to adults at work, to adults in retirement. We move houses, we change jobs, we make friends and then someone moves, we get new bosses, and on and on it goes. So the wonder questions then are, "Why does yet another transition seem to take us by surprise?" and, "Why do we keep expecting that another transition won't happen?" or even, "What makes us think that a transition shouldn't happen or is bad if it does?"

I can't answer these for you, but I can tell you how I have worked on these thoughts myself this past year in light of the various transitions that NPC has faced and is experiencing both with staff and with property. What's happening here at NPC is normal. No church building has ever lasted without some remodeling or fixing up! Nobody stays in one place forever. No church has a founding pastor who built it and then preaches until he or she is 95 and meets the Lord mid sermon. Let's face it – even the Apostle Paul didn't stick around just one church location during his whole ministry, nor did the other Apostles. No, the Gospel message, the Good News of Jesus, is meant to be spread. In Acts 1, the Lord tells his disciples that once they receive power from the Holy Spirit they will be God's witnesses in Jerusalem, Judea, Samaria, and into the uttermost parts of the world. We are not meant to only be in one place. Ok, then. What do we do when we are in a place for 'a season' - like all of us right now in Darien, at NPC? Well, I think we are to use our gifts to build relationships with each other and grow the church while we can. Remember what James told us (James 4:13-15) "You should know better than to say, 'Today or tomorrow

we will go to the city. We will do business there for a year and make a lot of money!' What do you know about tomorrow? How can you be so sure about your life? It is nothing more than mist that appears for only a little while before it disappears. You should say, 'If the Lord lets us live, we will do these things." It seems to me that we should acknowledge that the Lord is letting us do what we are doing right now and we should do our part to share the Good News of lesus with those around us for however long God lets us be together. We should be ready for whatever next transition God has planned. Jesus said in Matthew 28:19 "Therefore, go and make disciples of all nations." He didn't say, "Therefore, stay." So I've asked myself; "Who in my life has 'stayed' forever?" My parents have been with me the longest of course, but soon even they will leave me. So actually, if I'm honest, only the Lord is my sure and certain forever person, just as He promised in Matthew 28: 20, "And surely, I am with you always, even to the very end of the age."

So, what's the point in all of these "wonderings" you ask? Well, for me it makes me realize that my job is to do my best at preparing children and youth to "GO" and use their God-given gifts to tell others about Jesus - they won't be here forever you know! I should also be equipping moms, dads and other adults to use their gifts just as the Bible tells us to. I think I should work on building relationships with others who are at NPC for as long as we are with each other. I want to share my home and my life for Christ's purposes so that, with you, we can be a witness to this community. I need to be ready to say goodbye to our teens who graduate and go off to college but I want to be sure that this church family has prepared them to be people of strong faith and that they have good relationships with you, not just me or a pastor. They need lots of connections.

Right now, NPC is at a fantastic moment in her history to show this community what it means to be "Church"

and not totally dependent upon a building. We won't have the perfect spaces to come to for everything right now so maybe we should start meeting at the parks, in the restaurants, at the library, and especially in our homes. People will see that we, the people of NPC, really love each other and are committed to each other because we live here! Tot Drop



fter months of watching
"diggers" pushing and
dumping dirt outside our windows,
the temporary playground, which will

be shared by Tot Drop and the Nursery School, has received flying colors in its final inspection by the state Department of Health licensing agent. We are now enjoying playing under a glorious canopy of shade trees, nestled behind the stockade fence, between the Parlor and the Chapel. All the climbing structures were moved from the old playground to the new space, but it all feels fresh and different in its new setting!



Give me a shovel and I can dig all day! (Orange fencing is retractable so we can section off playground as required by state regs.)

Maximum group size for children under the age of three is eight. This State regulation means that physical barriers are required to separate the space for each group of 8 children. Because there will be four groups of 8 children (one class of I year olds, and three groups of 2 year olds) sharing the playground at one time, we have installed retractable fencing to divide the playground into four spaces. New sandboxes were constructed to provide quieter play opportunities in each of the spaces and each

area has appropriate and varied equipment. There are two areas with climbing and sliding structures, one area for riding wheeled vehicles and one small area especially equipped for one year olds.

We have worked out a shared schedule for NPNS and Tot Drop children to be on the playground together until each organization once again has its own playground. This schedule will go into full effect when the Nursery School resumes in the fall.

An unusual happening for Tot Drop takes place this summer when it closes from July 3 until August 4 to facilitate the construction projects in the CE Wing. Tot Drop families have graciously accepted this inconvenience and we are most grateful. When we return in August we will have some summertime special events like we usually do, including our world-famous water days, visits from the library, sing-alongs with "Beautiful Marcia", outdoor art events, Tot Drop Olympics and more—on our tree-shaded playground.

NPC and World Vision in the Dominican Republic

s we embark on a new partnership with World Vision in the community of Palmera we wanted to look back and celebrate the blessing we have experienced through our relationship with the people of Restauracion in our previous partnership with World Vision and the wonderful progress towards a self-

sustaining community that has been made. Carleton Cleveland, is an NPC member who was actively involved in this partnership and shares his perspective in the following article.

In 2003 World Vision approached Noroton Presbyterian Church to ask it to solicit its congregation for one-on-one and personal sponsorship of children in the Dominican Republic (DR). The Church agreed to do this, and NPC's members sponsored around 200 children.

World Vision then asked the Church for financial participation in two projects it was doing along the northwest quadrant of the DR along the Haitian border, a hugely impoverished area. One was the construction of a six kilometer irrigation pipeline that would bring

water from the Artibonito River to a desolate area called Guayajayuco so crops could eventually be grown there, the other was the construction of a library in Loma de Cabrerra, a town nearby, where the children were very educationally challenged.

After a due diligence trip to the DR in October of 2003, the Church, at the recommendation of the Mission Team, agreed to fund a substantial portion of the costs of these projects.

In subsequent years the Mission Team and other NPCers visited these projects annually to see personally how these projects were coming along, to visit the sponsored children there and to become somewhat involved with the community. This is sustainable and

has built a lasting long-term relationship with all involved.

Along the way NPC's members also funded the building of ten houses in Ravenzal for families of four or more. These houses were donated by NPC members and did not come out of the mission budget.

Today Guayajayuco is a thriving community with families moving in from the major cities. It is not only self-sustaining but it exports, thanks to the irrigation system, com and beans to a restaurant chain in Florida.

The library is well stocked with a host of books donated by the Pear Tree Point School in Darien and includes a clinic that educates women in pre-natal health issues

and HIV-AIDS prevention.

In addition, a number of NPCers have separately arranged for certain financial accommodations for their sponsored children. This is done through World Vision and does not involve the Church's budget. There are many, many heartwarming (and funny) stories here.

I will tell you that being involved in this has been a God-given life changing experience that may not be repeated for me again.

The number of orange ribbons (our symbol of child sponsorship) worn on Mother's Day shows us how many NPC members are actively

supporting children in Restauracion. We give thanks and praise for that. World Vision partners with communities to help them become self-sustaining. Restauracion is achieving that goal, so World Vision's work there is coming to a close. The Mission Team at NPC is excited by our new partnership with World Vision in the area of Palmera, just outside Santo Domingo. We hope you will consider sponsoring a child and becoming part of this lifechanging ministry.


