

Dear Friends:

There are several major events happening in the next two months that I would like to highlight – events that I hope you would like to take part in with others from this church family.

First, as you receive this we will be entering the season of Lent - a time to consider our mortality in preparation for Holy Week and the celebration of Easter. I have found that it doesn't really matter whether Lent begins earlier or later each

spring, it has the habit of "sneaking up" on us. This year during Lent we will be preaching on themes from the book *Sinning Like a Christian* by William Willimon. The book, which provides a fresh understanding of the seven deadly sins, will be available for purchase and conversation groups will be available for you to meet with a small group of others to discuss the themes of the book. Ash Wednesday services will be held on Wednesday, March 1.

Second, NPC will be hosting Pastor Tim Keller for Noroton Lectures on March 4 and 5. Tim will be speaking on the topic of prayer. By way of preparation or follow up, you may want to read his book entitled, *Prayer: Experiencing Awe and Intimacy with God.*

Third, late in March (3/25) we will be having an all church "pi" day. That is not a misprint. March 14 (3/14) is also known as "pi" day (3.14) and we will be having a fun celebration later in the month with pies of all kinds – fruit pies, meat pies, pizza pies . . . you get the idea.

Fourth, Holy Week services are happening: Palm Sunday (4/9), Maundy Thursday (4/13), Good Friday (4/14 community service), Easter Vigil (4/15) and Easter (4/16).

Fifth, we will have a guest preacher, The Rev. Dr. Mark Roberts, who will be with us the Sunday after Easter (4/23). Mark has been a personal friend for many years and is currently the Executive Director of the De Pree Center at Fuller Theological Seminary. In this position he helps people to think about vocation and living out their faith in daily life.

And last, but by no means least, we will have our NPC Service Day on the last Sunday of April (4/30). This was a great day in the life of our congregation last spring and our hopes are high for it this year as well.

Please mark your calendars now. I can't wait for what is coming!





The History of Noroton Lectures

This March we will have the great opportunity to learn from Dr. Timothy Keller who is our Noroton Lecture speaker for 2017. Dr. Keller is the senior pastor of Redeemer Presbyterian Church in New York City and a very prolific writer as well.

Did you know that Noroton Lectures began 38 years ago when the Reverend Edward Danks was our pastor? When Ed came to NPC in 1977 he was asked to increase our biblical learning opportunities. He envisioned a renewal weekend during the cold winter months in which NPC members could be inspired to greater faith. In southern churches this could have been called a "revival". The early lectures were funded from insurance proceeds following the death of Ed and Barbie Danks's eighteen year old son Tom shortly after they arrived in Darien.

The first speaker in early 1979 was Dr. Lloyd Ogilvie who was the pastor of the Hollywood Presbyterian Church and who became the chaplain to the US Senate. From the beginning there was a men's breakfast with the speaker, followed by a woman's coffee, a Saturday night lecture and Sunday worship.

All the speakers below can be found online with their bios. Each was an outstanding teacher and/or writer. The people of NPC have been greatly blessed by the presence of each lecturer. The vision of Ed Danks in providing a weekend of challenge and growth continues to this day.

He lifted me out of the slimy pit, out of the mud and mire; he set my feet on a rock and gave me a **firm** place to **stand**. –Psalm 40:2

Do you ever have one of those seasons where a particular phrase seems to be hunting you down? I keep seeing the phrase "Stand Firm" everywhere.

Maybe it's from our Tuesday morning Bible study. I Corinthians 10:12- if you think you are **standing firm**, be careful that you don't fall!' I Corinthians 15:58-Therefore, my dear bothers and sisters- **stand firm**. And in chapter 16:13 Be on your guard. **Stand firm** in the faith. Be courageous. Be strong. Not to mention the passage in Ephesians 6 as Paul is talking about the armor of God: therefore put on the full armor of God, so that when the day of evil comes, you may be able to **stand your ground**, and after you have done everything, **to stand. Stand firm** then...

I wonder why this phrase keeps showing up for me? Perhaps it's because of our cultural/political climate. To take a stand, stand firm, stand one's ground... is a solid act. It's not passive. Standing is not a posture of attack. It's assertive without demanding one's own way. It's remaining clear and calm in the midst of any chaos that surrounds. Hmm.

With this phrase in mind, I did a little "Bible Gateway" lookup. I found treasure!

I will declare that your love **stands firm** forever, that you have established your faithfulness in heaven itself. (Psalm 89:2)

If you do not **stand firm** in your faith, you will not stand at all. (Isaiah 7:9)

Everyone will hate you because of me, but the one who **stands firm** to the end will be saved. (Mark 13:13)

Stand firm, and you will win life. (Luke 21:9)

My prayer for us as we walk through this season of Lent, is that we each find ways to stand firm in Christ. Whether in conversation or prayer: Action or rest.



Pi Day is an annual celebration of the mathematical constant π (pi), observed around the world on **March 14 (3/14)** since 3, 1, and 4 are the first three significant digits of π .

The Greek letter Pi represents a constant used in mathematics — the ratio of the circumference of 3.14159. Pi has been calculated to over one trillion digits beyond its decimal point. A 'p' was chosen for 'perimeter' of circles, and was first used in 1706.

Pie History: a baked dish, which is usually made of a pastry dough casing, that covers or contains various sweet or savory ingredients, in a variety of sizes and shapes, and crusts... pastry, shortbread, biscuits, mashed potatoes, crumbs.
