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Lessons from a **Pilgrimage**

your trip Sam?" is the greeting I've been receiving since returning

from a pilgrimage to the Holy Land. 14 of us from Noroton, along with two couples who were friends of our members, just returned from our 12-day, more than 12,000-mile odyssey. With 8 days in Israel, 2 in Jordan and 2 for travel on either end – we packed a lot of learning and sight seeing into these days. We visited the Roman capital of Caesarea where Peter preached to a Roman centurion and Paul was held in prison. We visited Nazareth and then had a boat ride on the Sea of Galilee. There we saw a first century boat that had been reclaimed from the mud (they are smaller than you think). We visited the archaeological sites of cities that Jesus taught in like Capernaum and Magdala and even read the start of the Sermon on the Mount on the Mount of the Beatitudes. We visited the baptism site of John the Baptist on the Jordan (where one pilgrim was baptized and many of us renewed our baptismal vows) and floated on the salt saturated Dead Sea (the lowest spot on earth at 1,407 feet below sea level). We walked around Herod the

low was Great's mountain top fortress – Masada - a place he never stayed in, and saw the streams of En Gedi flowing in the wilderness. After visiting Qumran, the site of the Dead Sea Scrolls, we went up - in elevation and mountain roads to Jerusalem. Visits there included the water tunnel of Hezekiah, the Temple Mount and the Wailing Wall. We even walked the sites of our Lord's suffering on the Via Delarosa ending at the church of the Holy Sepulcher. We broke bread and had communion in the Garden Tomb. And we visited Bethlehem and the Church of the Nativity too. Finally, a visit to Jordan took us to the well-preserved Roman city of Jerash, and the amazing hide-away of the Nabatians in Petra. We caught the same glimpse of the Promised Land from Mt. Nebo that Moses had, and we visited with our missionary in Jordan, Dr. Hanna Massad. We learned of Jordan's water shortages and current difficulties of hosting almost 3,000,000 refugees from the wars in Syria and

Do You Have a Safety Net?

"Finally, all of you, be like-minded, be sympathetic, love one another, be compassionate and humble" (1 Peter 3:8 NIV)

As a pastor, I see situations daily that nobody should ever have to go through alone. Nobody should ever have to wait in the hospital while a loved one is in life-or-death surgery. No woman should ever have to wait alone for the lab report on a problem pregnancy. Nobody should ever have to wait for news from a battlefield alone. Nobody should ever have to stand at the edge of an open grave alone. Nobody should ever have to spend the first night alone when his or her spouse has just walked out.

Life's tough times and tragedies are inevitable; each of us will face them. But we don't need to go through them alone. We need God's safety net to help hold us up through these difficult times.

What is God's safety net? It is a group of other believers — a handful of people who are really committed to you. We call this kind of group a community. Here's God's plan for community: "If one part suffers, every part suffers with it" (I Corinthians I 2:26a NIV). Community is God's answer to despair.

Romans 12:15 expresses a similar idea: "Rejoice with those who rejoice; mourn with those who mourn."

The first part of that verse is easy. When something good happens to someone, it's often easy to join in on the party.

But when someone is having a tough time, it can seem more difficult. But, really, it's simple. When you're going through a crisis, you don't want advice; you just want somebody to be there to sit with you, hold your hand, put an arm around your shoulder, or cry with you.

As Paul tells us, "Therefore encourage one another and build each other up" (I Thessalonians 5:11a). Encouraging someone else doesn't always mean giving a pep talk or words of wisdom. Sometimes the best kind of encouragement is just sitting in silence, waiting and weeping with a friend.

Do you have a safety net — a group of fellow Christians you know you can count on in life's toughest times? If not, go out today and begin building those friendships. The hard times in life are inevitable, and only a fool would go into them unprepared.

we all have seasons in our lives in which we are especially mindful that we need God to be present: transforming, comforting, and challenging us. Perhaps it occurs when

our circumstances change. A job is lost. A spouse falls gravely ill. A divorce looks imminent. A new child is more stressful than anticipated. A home becomes too much to handle, and a move is required.

Sometimes, we need a brother or a sister to walk with us, and remind us who we are, and to whom we belong. Here at NPC, we call these brothers and sisters Stephen Ministers.

One of the most beautiful slices of ministry that I have experienced here at NPC has been the training of a new class of Stephen Ministers. Every Wednesday night since January, a group of I 3 trainees has gathered with leaders to intentionally learn how to serve individuals in our church family. We talk about ways to bring Christ into many different life circumstances. We learn how to listen with open hearts. We talk about different forms of crisis. We practice prayer.

On May 22nd in worship, we will be commissioning 13 new Stephen Ministers. Each have been through 50 hours of specialized training in Christian caregiving, and

join a team of already active Stephen Ministers here at NPC. They are each ready to provide confidential one-to-one Christian care to people experiencing a crisis or going through a difficult time. Stephen Ministers meet weekly with their care receiver for around an hour to listen, care, encourage, pray and provide emotional and spiritual support for the person. Caring relationships last for as long as the person's need persists.

I ask for you to pray for these soon-to-becommissioned Stephen Ministers. Pray that God would bless their ministry and work through them to bring hope and healing to those they are serving. Please also pray for the continued ministry of our other active Stephen Ministers.

Perhaps you are reading this article and wondering whether God might use a Stephen Minister in your circumstance, or in the life of someone you know, to bring healing and wholeness. If you do feel that tug, please reach out to me. I would love an opportunity to talk more with you about receiving care through a Stephen Minister. 



Minute with Mickie — May – A month for Prayer, Praise and Purpose

ay is a crazy month. We hear it all the time. "We are so busy in May." Let me see if we can think through this month and turn it into a time for Prayer, Praise and Purpose instead of

another crazy month of activities that send you into a tizzy.

So first, let's look at PRAYER – **May 5**th, the first Thursday of this month is *The National Day of Prayer*. Take some time to slow down your day on May 5th and pray together as a family. Here are a few suggestions:


- I. Wake the children up differently today. Go into each room and sit on the edge of each child's bed and say a prayer out loud for that child. Something like: "Lord, bless (child's name). Help him/her feel your presence today. Thank you that you gave this child to me. Help me to appreciate his/her special traits. In Jesus name, Amen." Then wake them up with a silly song and a hug.
- 2. While driving in the car, ask your children to look out the window and say a prayer of thanksgiving for the things that they see.
- 3. When they get home from school, turn snack time into a time to pray for their school, friends and teachers.
- 4. At dinner time, hold hands around the table and pray the Lord's Prayer together.

5. Finally, at bedtime, talk about how praying together is important and that it has been National Prayer Day. Pray a favorite Bedtime prayer for good sleep, thanking God for a great day.

For PRAISE - May Ist our Horton Hall kids will be praising God as we study the incredible miracle at Pentecost. Doing experiments with Red Balloons, fire that doesn't burn, streamers, and watching Buck Denver, will make this Sunday a praise-filled day. Suggestions for how to praise God all month long will be on our website. Then to even keep PRAISE going into June, don't forget to set aside JAM Singers' Worship experience of Praise as they lead us to understand what God means when He tells us to "Make a Joyful Noise." What Makes NPCC Meaningful

NPCC is a full-time, child care ministry that serves over 60 children and their families. At this point in time, 56% of our families live in Darien while 44% travel from Stamford, Norwalk, New Canaan, Weston, Southport, and Fairfield. Additionally, 54% of our families have more than one child enrolled in our program, while 39% of our families use our program five days a week.

We recently asked some of our parents why NPCC is meaningful to their families. Here are some of their written responses:

"NPCC has been such a huge part of our family's life. With both my husband I working full-time, it's such a comfort to know that our boys are in such great, loving care. If we ever need to check in during the day, we always get a return text/email/call promptly - very reassuring when we are not able to be there! Youth Ministry

NOROTON YOUTH MINISTRY

In a community like ours, youth and families live busy lives running from one thing to the next. And in the midst of our busy-ness, it can be

difficult for Christian disciples of all ages to find time to get away to participate in mission experiences—even when they want to. Seeking to address this, the Youth Ministry Team set out early last year to discern and identify a significant mission opportunity that would afford youth and their parents the opportunity to serve in mission while also allowing space to attend to the other demands of their schedule. The team discerned that this could be accomplished through a mission experience we call *Bridge to City*.

Bridge to City is designed as an urban mission experience in which youth and parents engage in mission service work over the course of a weekend. As part of the experience, participants: travel to and from the city via train, move about the city by subway and foot, and engage in mission service and guided spiritual reflection throughout the weekend. With this schedule, participants who need to be back at work on Monday morning are able to do so—and families that want to serve in mission during the school break while also planning time for vacation are able to do both.

Last month, eleven participants participated in the first Bridge to City mission experience. During the course of the weekend, the team served alongside residents of Brooklyn at East New York Farms—an organization



that is addressing food justice in that community through local sustainable agriculture and community-led economic development. Participants also met with Pastor James Steward at the South Bushwick Reformed Church—hearing his congregation's vision for reaching the community and assisting with clean-up work in the church building (a building and congregation that was affected by a tornado that struck the city in 2007). In addition to these two sites, participants had the opportunity to visit with elderly in the community through a special program of DOROT.



The mission weekend concluded with a prayer tour of the city on Sunday afternoon. As part of this tour, participants were invited to see the city the way that God sees it—with the team stopping at points along the way to consider, reflect, and pray. An incredible experience for all of the participants—and a tremendous weekend of service.

With such a tremendous experience of prayer and service in this first Bridge to City, plans are already underway for Bridge to City 2017, which is tentatively scheduled for April 8-10, 2017. Additional information about this experience will be available beginning this fall.


We encourage you to join us in this endeavor ...
