A Weekend You Will Not Want to Miss

ow many 150 year olds birthday parties have you attended? Not many, if any,

I'm guessing. November 4, 1863, Noroton Presbyterian Church (which began as the First Presbyterian Church of Darien and then changed it's name at the annual meeting in 1930) will be 150 years old. That's amazing! With God's help and the great dedication some very committed founders, our church weathered the aftermath of the Civil War, the 17 year long depression of the late 1800s, World War I and II. The Great Depression and several coastal hurricanes. Faithful members gave sacrificially to establish a house of worship on the west end of the Post Road for the preaching of the gospel and the ministry of the Word and Sacraments. Once we had laid a solid foundation, we became great supporters of local and international ministries that shared the love of the Lord around the world. As Psalm 100 reminds us, God has blessed us and we have experienced His faithfulness, "through all generations".

Our history committee, under the wonderful leadership of Rosemary Mace, has done an outstanding job preparing for this yearlong celebration. Their diligent study of our past

(including the reading of all of the past session minutes!), the wonderful display of the pictorial timeline in our hallways, the sharing of snippets of our history in various venues, the invitation of former Associate Pastors to return, the choir anthems this fall representative of each decade of our past, has reminded us of our roots. Last month, Rosemary gave an outstanding lecture on the founders of our church and how, over 90 years of planning and giving, the gifts that they gave brought our Post Road property together. If you were not able to attend, don't worry, we captured it on video and made a DVD. You may check out a copy from our office or buy a copy of her inspiring presentation. We have even worked with the local Boy Scouts and neighbors and cleaned up the Weed Cemetery where many of our founders are buried. This team has done an outstanding job of helping us remember our roots and God's goodness to us.

So now we will culminate our year of celebration on the weekend of November 2nd and 3rd. On Saturday the 2nd we begin with a wonderful Hymn Sing at 7 p.m. in the Sanctuary, where our returning Associate Pastors, Mark Orr, and Connie and David Jordan-Haas will join us and bring

FOUNDATIONS FOR THE FUTURE November 2013 Progress Report

Supporting Missions:

In September the Session approved two additional Foundations for the Future mission grants. First, we will be providing funding to assist in construction of a women's dormitory at Forman College in Pakistan. Forman has had difficulty attracting and keeping women students due to a lack of housing for women. The new dormitory will help address this. Incidentally, the Forman College Infirmary Health Clinic, which was built using our earlier Foundations grant, has been named "Jesus the Healer", a wonderful statement in that non-Christian country! Second, we will be providing support for the Fellowship of Christian Athletes as they work to establish a presence in Fairfield County. FCA brings God's message to coaches and athletes at high school and college levels.

Praise God for these wonderful new blessings possible through your gifts!

Strengthening our Foundation:

The Building Committee is working through the process of getting our building plan approved by the town of Darien. The response so far from the Planning & Zoning board has been positive, and we are hopeful that we will have final approval in November. Our neighbors have been informed throughout the process and their concerns have been addressed.

In the meantime, you may have noticed work proceeding on the Post Road side of the church. This project will install natural gas heating to replace our old oilfueled boilers. The replacement should enable NPC to realize significant savings on its heating expense going forward. To prepare for this project, the Properties Team reconfigured the Nursery School space over the summer to move the office, classrooms, and to create a new mechanical room.



God's Grace Through Your Giving:



to us and how much it would buoy us emotionally to receive cards and texts and e-mails and food from so many friends. Thank you.

My father taught me so many lessons over the years about how to live as a man of faith in Jesus Christ that I guess I never really expected that he would also teach me how to die as a man of faith. But he did. Like any good teacher, he was still offering lessons until the very end, even when he couldn't speak.

He taught me to trust in the goodness and love of God even when his body was wracked with pain and suffering. He taught me to love until the very end and never miss an opportunity to express it. He taught me to face death with triumphant faith in the promises of God. He taught me about courage and dignity and humility.

When I was a teenager and would complain about something he used to torture me with the passage from I Thessalonians 5:16 by telling me that it was God's will to give thanks in all circumstances. Used to drive me crazy.

In the days leading up to his death my father began spending more and more hours of the day asleep at the Hospice facility. It was beginning to sink in with all of us that he wasn't going to wake up again. But then he did.

He surprised all of us by suddenly waking up, lucid and alert. My mother asked the caregivers to roll his bed out into the great room so she could sit at the grand piano and they could worship together. They spent an hour worshipping God. Several hours later he went to sleep and didn't wake up again. His last act of open cognition was to *give thanks AT ALL TIMES*. Even at the point of death. Because as he would say, "God is always worthy of our worship."

I will bless the Lord at all times, his praise will be continually on my lips (Psalm 34:1).

Tot Drop



Sually I like to share news about Tot Drop that most readers of the Spire probably don't know about since we are not that visible unless you have reason to be in the CE Wing. Today, however, I would like to write this specifically to those readers who do find their way through the security doors into our area.


Safety is always a key concern when you work with young children. When I started my teaching career (Oh, so-o-o-o long ago!) building security issues were much more back burner concerns. It was a much simpler, smaller world. Today, the cruelty of a few deranged minds has brought security to the front burner, and is even requiring a fire extinguisher to be kept at arm's reach because it is such a hot topic. Following the horror of Sandy Hook, so close to home, all of NPC became much more conscious of vulnerable points. Both NPNS and Tot Drop have made significant changes at considerable expense to ensure as safe an environment as possible.

Here is where each one reading the Spire can help. Some of you have needed to know the code for the security doors at the entry point to NPNS or Tot Drop in order to take care of your church needs. There is no problem with that! The problem arises when you allow others whom you don't know and who don't have the code to enter these secure areas along with you. Many times people show up in the Tot Drop hallway or at the door of my office who have no appointment and no one actually knows who they are. When asked how they got in through the security door, they invariably respond, "Some nice lady/man let me in because s/he knew the code." On the surface it seems the most polite, even Christian, thing to do! But it is not the safest option to take.

I am training staff and Tot Drop parents to say to unknown visitors, "I am sorry, I can't let you in, but I will let the director know that you are waiting."
(I was really grateful one day recently to have a Tot Drop parent, who knows me well, exit from the West entrance door—where the keypad is on the outer door. I was entering from the parking lot. As she left the building, she closed the door before I could come in, winked at me, and said the golden words, "I am sorry, I can't let you in, but I will let the director know that you are waiting." I was most appreciative that she had the message! Then she remarked how grateful she and her husband were to know these efforts were being made for the safety of their child.)

In addition, if you have children who accompany you into the CE Wing, they should NOT know the code, nor be the ones to enter the numbers on the keypad at your direction. From our point of view, there are no acceptable exceptions to this policy. Please join with us to do everything reasonable to protect these wonderful, innocent children and the staff who loves them!

OUR VISION

Our vision is to share the life-saving message of Jesus Christ with every teenager in New England by equipping youth ministry workers to reach the next generation!

OUR MISSION

Our mission is twofold: a) Training and supporting youth workers. Jesus said, "The Harvest is plentiful but the WORKERS ARE FEW." This fact is no more evident than here in the New England Region.

b) Connecting youth workers and youth ministry organizations for the purpose of sharing best practices, encouraging longevity to the call, and achieving synergy through collaborative efforts.

Here Are Some Highlights Of How God Has Blessed Us Since Our Launch In 2005:

In 2005 we began with one local youth ministry network serving 20 Fairfield County Youth workers. We now have thirty youth ministry networks across the six New England States serving more than 350 network members.

In 2005 we were working alone to serve local youth workers. Today we have a national platform serving as the National Network of Youth Ministries New England Regional Coordinators and have partnerships with 45 national and regional ministries and foundations such as the Willow Creek Association, GROUP Publishing, Youth Specialties, and the Chick Fil-A Winshape Foundation.

In 2005 we had no website or regional communications tools. We now have a part-time communications director, a regional website, Facebook page, Twitter, and twice monthly newsletters which connect and resource more than 850 youth workers.

In 2005 we had no training, equipping and support programs for youth workers. Today, we sponsor or cosponsor:

- The New England Youth and Campus Ministry Leader's Summit and Networking Lunches

- The monthly Youth Leader network gatherings across the region
- And coming this September, The Equip Conference for training next generation leaders
