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see the scenes so clearly." These are some of the responses pilgrims have had when they return from a trip to Israel. To walk the ancient streets of Jerusalem, to stand on the shores of the Sea of Galilee, to visit Jericho and Bethlehem, are some of the richest experiences of faith we can experience. After not doing Pastor-led spiritual tours for a few years, I'm happy to announce that I will be hosting a trip to Israel and Jordan in 2016 over the April school break. Our ten-day tour of Israel leaves Friday night, April 8th and returns on the 17th, or the 20th, if you sign up for the three day trip to Jordan. Roman ruins, lewish settlements, the hill country of the prophets and the places of Jesus' birth and death, will all be part of this visit. Nothing will bring the sites, sounds, and even smells, of the Biblical story alive like a trip to the Holy Land. It is truly a life changing experience.

We are holding this trip right after Easter, over the school Spring break for parents who want to bring their middle school or older students with them. Pilgrim

Tours will arrange our 4 and 5 star hotels, all air and land transportation, two meals a day and an Israeli Christian guide to accompany us throughout our journey. I'll be adding some color commentary and we hope to connect with our mission partner, Hanna Massad when we visit lordan and the ruins of Petra. The bargain rate for this tour is \$4,159, with airfare included for Israel only. The Jordan extension is an additional \$1,019. To learn more about the trip, please come to an information meeting in our new Post Road Mission room the evening of October 26th at 7:30. 




Men's Retreat October 9, 10 & 11, 2015 "Daring to be Better Than Good"

Yup.


I just don't want people to think I'm a 'whack-a-doo' Christian. I just don't want to be unhinged. I want to be respected and admired. I want to remain in control.

Minute with Mickie – Wondering about #TogetherInTheStory

lsn't it exciting to be in the new building space? We have been blessed thanks to the incredible sacrificial and gracious giving

from all of our Church Family. We are blessed as well by those who have poured hours and hours of prayer into each step in the process. We are continuing to pray that God would be honored in this place. I pray that what we do here with our children would bring God glory, and that our children would grow in faith, not just IN this place but THROUGH this place into the community and into the world. (Matthew 28:18-20; Acts 1:8)

This is an exciting year too because the NPC teaching and sermon focus will be on taking a journey through some key stories of Scripture. We are going to be Together in the Story. This means that together we are going to learn the same stories in the Worship Services that we learn in Sunday school classes. We are going to focus on the Wonder and Power of The Story that God has given us throughout time, showing God's great rescue plan for humankind. The children and I have been doing this already for three years in Horton Hall. Many of our children can already tell you their favorite stories of Scripture. We wonder about them together and they come up with some of the greatest questions that keep them digging into the Bible for clarification. I love it!

Children's Ministry

This year, all our Elementary Sunday School children, who have registered for Sunday school, will be given a special Together in the Story Booklet to encourage them, with parental help, to know the stories from the Bible that we will be doing in Horton Hall. Using this booklet will help everyone in your family remember what you heard in the Sanctuary as well as reinforce what each child heard in Horton Hall. In November, ten students will be asked to re-tell their favorite story to other children in Horton Hall as part of our Together in the Story experience. We want your children to see themselves in the pages of Scripture so they know and feel that God's Rescue Plan is for them, personally!

75% of the Biblical text is written in story form; 15% is written as poetry and song; only 10% is theological, didactic material and even that is wrapped in a story. Stories must be important to God since that's how God wrote the Bible. So let me tell you a quick story. In Joshua 23-24 we read that God allowed Israel to live in the Promised Land peacefully, but then at the end of Joshua's life Joshua saw that the people were taking on the idols and the views of the pagan cultures around them. Joshua warned them that God would remove His presence from them if they didn't obey God's Laws but followed man's instead. And do you know what Joshua did to remind people of who God is? He told them the stories of their history. He reiterated the stories of God's work in their lives starting with Abraham. Stories! The people listened and were moved to pledge to walk with God. Yet, at the beginning of the book of Judges, the story of what happened after they made this promise and Joshua died is this: "Joshua, son of Nun, the servant of the Lord, died at the age of a hundred and ten. And they buried him I the land of his inheritance.... After that whole generation had been gathered to their fathers, another generation grew up, who knew neither the Lord nor what He had done for Israel. Then the Israelites did evil in the eyes of the Lord and served Baals." (Judges 2:8-11):

We are in a new wonderful space where the good news of Jesus Christ can be proclaimed to the world even better than before, but we must tell the story of God's Great Rescue Plan from the Bible so that no one forgets. The message of the Gospel must not die with the older generation. We don't want to be the church that forgot and then our children would choose to "do evil in the sight of the Lord." Our children are the ones that need to carry this story into the next generation

after them. At NPC we want to be together with you in this marvelous story of God. Let's be "Together in the Story." Read the Bible with your family. Learn to tell and retell the stories with your children. Join us in Horton Hall. Register for Sunday School and receive our special Story Booklet. Then take some pictures of your family reading and telling God's Story. Post it on Facebook. Share it on Instagram. Tweet it to the world using #TogetherInTheStory - I'm going to.

Learning Moments at NPCC

ne of the joys of working with children is observing their learning moments... the moments when children -- individually or collectively, accidentally or purposefully, rapidly or slowly -- make a discovery or explore a new phenomenon. Here are a few learning moments that we have observed at NPCC:



Exploring Gravity. In the ones class, Luke, JJ and Blaise take turns placing an upside down Lego block at the top of the climbing wedge. Together, with Caroline, who is sitting on the top of the climbing structure, they watch the block slowly slide down the ramp, over and over again.



Exploring Force. In the twos class, Alejandro, Luca, Sarah and Morgan build a tower in the sensory table. I-2-3-4-5-6! As soon as Sarah has placed the very last Lego block,

Alejandro knocks over the tower, and children shout, "Aaaaaaa!" They repeat the game three or four more times before heading off to other discoveries.



Exploring Waves: When children in the threes class move long ropes side to side, they discovered that they can create cool patterns called transverse waves. Teddy says to no one in particular, "It's going in different directions... at the same time!"

It is true that learning moments cannot be forced. Not even the most outstanding parent or teacher can summon a learning moment. What we can do, however, is fashion a context for them. We can provide a variety of experiences, foster a sense of playfulness and surrender to serendipity.


have settled into the routine of school.

NPC Gives Hope in Kenya

NPC has seven mission projects in Kenya – and Marilyn and John Parker visited all of them during their recent time there. They made videos which are being edited and will be shown soon. All of the students and missionaries expressed their gratitude for the prayers and financial support of Noroton Presbyterian Church.

Nambale Magnet School in Western Kenya was awarded a Foundations for the Future grant to build a new dorm. The first floor is now finished and is home for 64 sponsored girls - who would not be in school without the help of many donors in the US.





Caroline King'ori has been supported by NPC since joining Life Ministry Kenya in 2009. She has had the joy of sharing Christ with young people in Kenya, Nigeria and Swaziland. She now serves at United States International University. She conducts Bible studies off campus because the university is highly secular and religious activities are discouraged. "USIU is a hard ground", but she knows that the students are "God's creation and that His desire is that they hear the gospel." Caroline will be visiting NPC in mid October.

Joyce Aoko Aruga received a Foundations for the Future grant. She currently teaches in Mathare, a Nairobi slum, and has just completed the requirements for a Bachelor's in Education. She has an amazing story: sent far from home to be a housegirl when very young; led to Christ through a chance encounter with a stranger as she was sick and sleeping under a tree; completing her secondary education and then teachers college and now university.





Mercy Kilel has a Foundations for the Future grant to pursue a degree in Psychology and Counseling at Daystar University in Nairobi. When she finishes her studies, she would like to work with the children at City of Hope, in Tanzania. She reads the Bible every day to get answers to many things she faces in life, and has ".. noticed that actually, we find everything we need in the Bible."

Vivian Wambui Koigi has an NPC scholarship, and is a third year law student at Riara University. She hopes to join the Kenya School of Law to enable her to get admitted to the bar - and then to engage in International Law, and to practice locally, and to volunteer in Women's and Children's organizations. She believes this will give her a platform to educate people about their rights, and to fight injustices in society.

Patterson Mwakio has an NPC scholarship and is now an intern in Clinical Medicine. He was motivated to go into medicine in 2006 when he visited his mother in a government hospital and noticed the severe lack of medical personnel. Not many years ago, he was a street boy in Mombasa. A nun sponsored his secondary education, he got the NPC scholarship and now he's delivering babies in Nakuru Provincial Hospital.





Bob and Jennifer Chedester have been supported by NPC for the 15 years they've been in East Africa – first in Uganda for 10 years, and then in Kenya at Rift Valley Academy. RVA is over a hundred years old – it is one of the best schools in Africa - and there are 500 students there, most of whom are children of missionaries who are serving throughout Africa.



TogetherInTheStory - Noticing God in Prayer



"Ask, and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you. For everyone who asks receives, and the one who seeks, finds, and the one who knocks it will be opened." Matthew 7:7-8 (ESV)

Did you know that as we prepare to enter our new building, a group of people have been meeting to think about how Christ may be calling our congregation to use this building to bless our community? Did you know that they came up with a list of about 50 ideas? And that this felt very exhausting? So, back to the drawing board. They decided to pray. And a crazy thing happened. Each person, without consulting the others on the team, got the same message. "Pray more."

Pray more? Is that it? Pray more?

It seems so. Because only as we open ourselves up to listen and surrender to Christ can we really enter joyfully into whatever we are called to do.

When it comes to prayer, we identify ourselves along a spectrum from 'prayer warriors' to 'extremely uncomfortable' with many of us falling somewhere in between. In Tim Keller's recent book, Prayer: Experiencing Awe and Intimacy with God, he quotes, "Prayer must be, then, one of the hardest things in the world. To admit that prayer is very hard, however, can be encouraging. If you struggle in this, you are not alone."

So now we have a group of people who are committed to praying more. And prayer seems to be changing us. We hope it's contagious and that some of our experiences in prayer will inspire even more of our beloved community to join in and pray more, too! What a gift

to be open to the surprising ways that God answers prayer and blesses us. We thought it would be fun to share some of our experiences: and we'd LOVE to hear some of the ways you're encountering Christ in prayer! We'll spend time in each Spire with a "Pray More" report!

Here's our first one:

I've been praying for clarity and guidance on how to be a better mother, because I can see that I need to make some changes. There's so much advice available on the subject of parenting that it gets very overwhelming. I wanted to know God's will for me. Then, just the other day, as we were hurrying to get ready to leave the house, my daughter was instead standing in front of the mirror making all kinds of funny faces. Usually my response would have been to say "Stop goofing around, we need to go." This time, I look at her and laughed so hard. She was so pleased. She hugged me and said "Mommy, I love when I can make you laugh. Usually you have a frowny face." I am sure that was God sending me a clear message in response to my prayers that what my children need above all is my attention, my love, and the best parts of who He created me to be.
