All Things New

ne of great promises of our faith in Christ is that the old and worn are

made new. Once we join the faith we are told that "in Christ' we are a "new creation" (II Cor. 5:17). The end of time will culminate with the revelation of a "new heaven and a new earth." (Rev 21:1). The worn out is gone, the new has arrived. As much as we resist change at times, isn't it good to know that our faith reminds us that we are becoming someone who is "new and improved?" This is our great hope, especially if we have been stuck in a rut or in a self-defeating pattern. The Old Testament is the story of Israel constantly needing a renewal of purpose and faith, which God provided through the prophets.

Seven years ago, our Session started a planning process with an architect (possibly a modern day "prophet") to address some places where our ministries had become "stuck" due to poor performing facilities. We knew that many of the systems of the church facilities (the roofs, windows, electrical, sewage, air conditioning, to name

a few) were past their useful life while some had even been in service for 60 years. Multiple levels throughout our building made for stairs everywhere and tight hallways, which made moving from one end to the other difficult for our seniors and for those with babies in strollers. Our playgrounds located across our traffic flow to the parking lot made our situation quite dangerous. We had a lot to address.

Our first "renewal" project was the replacing of our historic steeple in 2008. We then began a thorough planning process which determined that it was time to redo the layout of our property and parking with great improvements to the building. A plan was purposed to take out the, "poor performing" 3,000 square foot, "center core," and replace it with 14,000 square feet of central offices, fellowship and educational spaces (freeing up the CE wing to be used more fully for children 7-days-a-week). In 2010, our architect, Dennis Kowal noted that we had, "an over performing ministry in an under performing building." His design became our master plan and the basis for the funds that we raised as we began our transformative Foundations for the Future journey.

This month, we are ready to finish

Due to the fantastic generosity of our members we were able to renew the majority of our ministry spaces, not only building the new entrance at the center core, relocating the playgrounds and parking lot, but also by adding AC and a fresh coat of paint to the Sanctuary (hint, the dusty peach color gives way to a new fresh look for this century), AC and new entrances for the CE wing, a return of the balcony to the Chapel and many system upgrades that will serve us well into the future while using modern technology to conserve energy. We will now have new opportunities to run innovative programs and even host the community again. May God be glorified through all of this and thank you one and all for your patience with these extensive renovations.

Of course what isn't visible on our church site are all the wonderful ways we were able to **build up God's work** around the world through the grants given to our mission partners from *Foundations for the Future*. 

"Together In The Story"

Small Group Scripture Study for Fall 2015

Pastor Sam and our pastoral staff will begin a sermon series that looks at the 'story of the Bible', hitting the highlights of God's encounters in ordinary lives.

This provides the perfect opportunity to provide curriculum and encourage the NPC community to engage in conversations about the scripture passages used as background to the Sunday sermons. Small Group Ministry will use the Sunday scripture and design a study series (think 'His Story ... History ... & Our Story'), using the Bible stories as models to share more of our own stories with each other.

The study is NOT a review of the sermon; it is a guide to going deeper into each week's scripture passage via an exploratory process:

- Observation
- Interpretation
- Application

Discussion questions will be available on our website or by calling the office to *ANYONE* who wants them ... whether to participate in an organized small group (existing or new), or to use with several friends, or even as a personal Bible study on your own.



For those who wish to lead or facilitate a group for this Fall season, we are also providing Leaders' Guides to accompany each week's scripture study discussion.

The Fall series will be comprised of ten passages, all stand-alone, starting mid-September.

- If your existing group meets every other week, you can use the scripture passage of the past week or the upcoming one ... your choice.
- You might choose to start a new group*, and meet for a month of four consecutive weeks, or meet for all ten weeks, or meet every other week. Each group can decide their own frequency and start times of meeting.
- For those who prefer a 'topical' study, we will be suggesting one or two studies 'themed' to the stories of the scripture in the Fall, 4-6 weeks in length, and DVD-based.

We will also be offering a 'drop in' small group time (available Sunday or a weekday evening) for those who find committing to a full series inconsistent with their Fall schedules. These 'come to as many as fit your schedule' offer maximum flexibility while still encouraging everyone to be engaged as much as possible.

Our Goal: that everyone in our church family has the chance to be involved in the same scripture conversation on any given week, and to incorporate God's word into our lives beyond Sunday worship.

For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven... God has made everything beautiful in its time...God's gift is that all should eat and drink and take pleasure in all their toil...that which is, already has been; that which is to be, already is, and God seeks out what has gone by... Ecclesiastes 3:1, 11, 13

y Grandpa Wolf died this summer. He was 95 and thriving right until the end, when he died peacefully in his sleep. A very

good man. A life well lived. I admire, respect and love him. And I've been thinking a lot about his legacy to our family. Without a doubt, it is the legacy of a strong character: humble, loyal, hard-working and wise. My prayer is that such traits are forming in my own life and the lives of my boys, his great-grandsons.

When I went back to Indiana for his memorial service, I found myself thinking about both my Grandpa and my widowed Grandma in the context of a book I've been reading: David Brook's *The Road to Character*.

Brook's main argument is that we live in a culture that celebrates the "Big Me"- It's the age of the selfie! When I think of myself in my own mind, do I see myself as a 'portrait' or as a small part of a larger 'landscape'? It's natural to approach the world as if you are the center of it. My Grandpa knew he was not! I believe he saw himself as a small part of a landscape painting: perhaps a painting of his beloved farm or mattress factory- perhaps a painting of WWII or the Indiana Philharmonic—or a painting of himself nestled into the generations that came before him and the generations that follow him.

Here's how Brooks put it: ...the world existed long before you and will last long after you... In the brief span of your life you have been thrown by fate, by history, by chance, by evolution, or by God into a specific place with specific problems and needs. Your job is to figure certain things out: What does this environment need in order to be made whole? What is it that needs repair? What tasks are lying around waiting to be performed?

Later in the book, he observed Alice had to be small to enter Wonderland. John the Baptist said it well in John 3:30- He must increase, but I must decrease. Basically, Brooks argues- the greatest virtue may just be humility. I hope you have a chance to pick up the book for yourself. It's well worth the read.

This is why we open scripture together. This is why we worship. This is why we pray! We need to remember who we are- beloved children of God, who has called us to be our best selves in the context of God's greater creation. Our character matters. Let's expose ourselves to have it shaped and molded by the one who loves us and who has given us gifts in order that we offer them to this beloved world!
