In your truthfulness, you have promised "I have loved you with an everlasting love." In your truthfulness, you have assured "This is my beloved Son." In your truthfulness, you have voiced, "Fear not, I am with you." In your truthfulness, you have guaranteed that "Nothing shall separate us from your love in Jesus Christ."

It is by your truthfulness that we love. And yet, we live in a world phony down deep in which we participate at a slant.

Ours is a seduced world,

where we call evil good and good evil, where we put darkness for light and light for darkness, where we call bitter sweet and sweet bitter (Isa. 5:20) where we call war peace and peace war,

So that we rarely see the truth of the matter.

Give us courage to depart the pretend world of euphemism, to call things by their right name, to use things for their right use, to love our neighbor as you love us. Overwhelm our fearful need to distort,

that we may fall back into your truth-telling about us, that we may be tellers of truth and practitioners of truth. We pray in the name of the One whom you have filled.

Faithfully Fit

God has a plan for your life: often it may not coincide with your ideas. That is the lesson Tracy Balderach accepted four years ago. After having her fourth baby in six years, she had not intended to enter the field of Coaching.

Abandoning her previous business career as an area representative for an IT company, she opted to combine the four cornerstones of her life: Faith, Family, Food and Fitness. The result: Faithfully Fit, a consultancy dedicated to helping individuals savor life's sweet moments.

"Soon after I had our fourth baby (in under 6 years), I realized that my life was one big FOG," Tracy recalled. "I was overweight, lethargic, cranky and wasn't truly savoring any of the sweet moments that were passing by so quickly. After praying about my situation, I made a commitment to make a change!"

During the next 90 days, she lost 30 pounds, but she gained more focus and energy. Her cloths fit again, but more importantly, her new lifestyle was impacting her

family in ways she had only previously hoped it would.

called. "I decided I wanted to help others who are on the same journey and struggling the same way I did."

Tracy effectively uses Facebook, YouTube, Pinterest and Snap Chat to spread the message that she is "Mama to 4 little ones, joy seeker, grace receiver, lover of life and health and fitness coach!" It connects. More than 2.300 Facebookers follow her.

One of her followers recalls: "I was stuck in a non-exercise rut. I could not motivate myself. Once I connected with Tracy, I was inspired. I really like low impact Tai Chen and a dance program called CIZE. They are for me."

Tracy builds a personal relationship with her clients. Spend a few moments and her engaging personality become evident. She is not afraid to share her own vulnerabilities.

Citing Phil 4:13, "I can do all things through Christ who strengthens me," as inspiration, Tracy learned to be bold in proclaiming her faith.

"She keeps pointing you back to Jesus," testifies her follower. "She overcame her challenges. She inspires you to believe that God will help you too!"

Minute with Mickie – Wondering about What's Happening Next?

It is actually July, as I write this article because, Lord willing, I will be teaching in India during the month of August when the deadline for this article is due. So, I am writing it now. a mission trip to teaching in India. I also
helped to dedicate a new well, bringing much needed
water to a Bible College. I'll tell you all about it when
Sunday School starts again.

What happened next? We all got our Backpack's Blessed on August 28 and received our new Bible verse key chain tags for our bags. A great way to show our friends that we are followers of Jesus right here in Fairfield County!

Now what's going to happen NEXT in September? First, we are going to say goodbye to Pastor Sam on Sunday, September 11, one service only at 10:00 am. We will all be together for Worship and having special time with Pastor Sam. There WILL be Sunday School and Nursery for our babies through Kindergarten that week. Elementary students will stay in the Sanctuary.

Then Sunday School for Elementary students will officially begin on September 18 at both 9:00 and 10:30 am, after Words of Wonder in the Sanctuary. We will be focusing our teaching this Fall on the Stories of the Old Testament that tell us about the Kings of Israel. We will start with the Story of Samuel, then learn about Saul and finally concentrate on the story of the life of David. with our incredible Huddle Leading in Horton Hall this year. Some should be getting a call (if you haven't already) from one of our Children's Ministry team members asking you to prayerfully (and seriously) consider being a Huddle Leader for our 1st – 5th graders in Horton Hall. If you've led in the past and found it rewarding I encourage you to encourage others (and send an email for us to share!).

Why serve in Children's Ministry?

- I. <u>Children are important to God</u>. There is no wondering about that! The Bible itself tells us that children are a blessing from God. Psalm 127:3 *Children are a blessing and a gift from the Lord.*
- 2. Serving in Children's Ministry is a legacy in and of itself. There are few ministry opportunities that allow you to leave a legacy for our children so directly. When you love and lead kids, you are also influencing generations to come. These children may one day be mothers and fathers perhaps even church leaders themselves. Either way, they will definitely be the future. Want to begin changing the world long term? Serve in Children's Ministry. Deuteronomy 4:9 You must be very careful not to forget the things you have seen God do for you. Keep reminding yourselves, and tell your children and grandchildren as well.
- 3. Teaching and showing our young children about Christ should be a top priority. Time has proven that most people who will come to Christ do so starting in childhood. The childhood years are the years of

greatest opportunity for the Gospel. If you want to see people come to Christ, if you want to help secure the future of your children and church then you should serve in Children's Ministry. Proverbs 22:6 Start children off on the way they should go, and even when they are old they will not turn from it.

- 4. Serving children will build humility into your character. Often, those who work hard in Children's Ministry are unintentionally overlooked. Sometimes this is discouraging but really, it's a blessing. It reminds me that what we do is for the glory of God, not our own. The reward is in Heaven. As for the here and now? It is a wonderfully humble place to serve. Colossians 3:12 Therefore, as God's chosen people, holy and dearly loved, clothe yourselves with compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience.
- 5. The #I qualification is love. As a young Christian, I discovered that many avenues of church service were beyond my abilities. You may never sing a solo or preach a sermon in church, but God wants you to find a place of ministry. Serving in the Children's Ministry is open to almost all Christians. If you love God and his children, then you are qualified to serve in Children's Ministry. Deuteronomy I 1:13 So if you faithfully obey the commands I am giving you today—to love the Lord your God and to serve him with all your heart and with all your soul—

Guessing we all have a lot of summer stories to share!









Mission News

/hile the majority of NPC Mission funding is allocated to our long term mission partners we are sometimes blessed with additional funds and hear of new ministries that we can help launch and encourage.

In early 2014 Mission team met with Jack and Svea Schreiner who were feeling called to step out in faith to serve the people of McDowell County, W Virginia. After prayer and discernment NPC made a special gift to help launch their ministry.

You can read below some excerpts from their letter written at the end of their two years of ministry, how God has blessed and used their time and talents for his glory.

> Stella Clarke Director of Missions

Dear friends at NPC,

There are many lessons that we learned from living in one of the most impoverished regions in the United States. Mainly, that not everybody is dealt the same hand at birth. There are so many complicated systemic problems in a place like this, and overcoming them is almost impossible without help. Addiction, health issues, poor educational opportunity, utter lack of employment options, and a general air of hopelessness all contributed to the poor outcomes for most residents of this county. The lack of infrastructure and dwindling population, as well as the geographical isolation, make it an undesirable location for future economic prospects, thus continuing the downward spiral that's been occurring for generations. We learned that so many of these problems are interconnected, and it is incredibly difficult to solve one without encountering another and another.



Warrior Creek Development

(WCD), the nonprofit organization that Jack co-founded with Craig Snow, worked to address a number of these issues. The first priority was to provide quality jobs and

skills for young people in the county, and we saw that goal come to fruition in Timmy, PJ, and Curtis - our first three interns. Together they constructed WCD's first project, the Teachers Village: three homes split into two apartments each to be rented out to teachers in time for this coming school year. This provides for a desperate need in a county that has had major staffing difficulties for decades, and provided an arena in which Jack could teach valuable, marketable skills to these young men, as well as coach them through personal and professional triumphs and trials.

Warrior Creek Development recently received a \$200,000 grant, which is a huge boon that will enable the organization to continue to grow. They have taken on three new interns, in addition to the three existing workers. If you are interested in supporting the ongoing mission there, you can do so by contacting Craig directly (snow@warriorcreekdev.org) for details.

Another exciting legacy of our efforts is occurring at the schools, where Svea's emphasis on recognition and support for new teachers seems to have finally made an impact. When she started, there was absolutely no orientation or guidance for the new teachers. Her second year, she implemented her own New Teacher Orientation, and helped support the new people in her building. The county is now intending to do its own two-day orientation before school starts each year. This could be a huge step toward reducing the roughly 40% turnover and poor retention rates for teachers in the county.

As mentioned above, we learned a lot of hard lessons

in our life in WV. However, there were still plenty of positive lessons to be gained as well. Resourcefulness, friendliness, community and interdependence, kindness and patience - all of these were traits we found in abundant supply from our friends and neighbors. With few people making much money and even fewer places to spend it, there is little opportunity for consumerism and excess to take hold. People find new functions for old materials, and work with what they have instead of constantly buying something new. The pace of life is slower, quieter, and more contained, and people actually have both the time and the inclination to simply sit on each other's porches and talk. There isn't the constant rushing and striving we see so often in middle class life; there is a peaceful contentedness in the neighborhoods and hollers. It was a valuable lesson to learn how to sit down and relax, without having an agenda or a timeline.

We will miss our dear friends and neighbors so much, as well as the pace of life that allowed us to enjoy them. The wilderness was truly breathtaking and the trips we took out onto the trails often left us speechless and grateful. There is truly no other place like it. We poured a lot of ourselves into our various callings in McDowell County. The schools, our neighborhood, the job sites, and the interns; we left so much of ourselves "out on the field," so to speak, and we don't regret any of it. There was incredible stress and strife, and incredible beauty and love. Thank you for participating in this amazing journey with us, and please keep McDowell County in your thoughts and prayers, as we will, today and always.
